Re: Heritage New Zealand involvement with Fletcher Housing Development Ihumatao, Mangere, Auckland

This letter is to inform you that this construction site is not supported by Tangata Whenua, families and residence of Ihumatao. The whenua is confiscated land and all the Tangata Whenua, families and residence are historical owners of the block. The construction site is illegal and is a collaboration between Fletchers, members of Ngati Whatua and in particular Maunga Whakahi executives, Naida Glavich and Margaret Kawharu. The project is also supported by New Zealand Heritage Trust. All of these entities including Fletcher Buildings Limited have collaborated to commit fraud upon the people of Ihumatao. This is a continuation of abuse perpetrated upon Ihumatao and its people, who are collectively the heirs and beneficiaries of the said land. The first incident of fraudulent activity was on the airport extension, where 86 sets of bodies were dug up from an ancient historical burial ground. Now Fletchers have conspired with the above-mentioned groups to commit fraud again upon the people of Ihumatao. The Heritage Trust are mandated to secure the best interest of Maori, their historical burial places and historical pa sites.

This letter is to advise Heritage New Zealand to withdraw its support for the project on the site and to allow all the land to be handed back to its beneficial owners to exercise mana whenua over all the land as left to them by their tupuna, ancestors. This matter has been forwarded to our head office in Brussels, Belgium to commence action in the court of human rights Strasberg France with immediate effect. It will also be tabled in the International Chamber of Commerce Switzerland and in the United Nations.

With respect, please take heed of the action being taken.
